TYNES AND WOODSBORO ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS



Students and staff at Tynes and Woodsboro Elementary schools walked into fully modernized campuses this school year. The work was done during the 2008-2009 school year. The scope of the work included the modernization of all permanent classrooms, library facilities, office, multi-purpose room and restrooms. Classrooms are equipped with interactive classroom technology, new furniture and spacious built-in storage areas. In addition, play areas, landscaping and black top areas will be renovated.

YORBA LINDA MIDDLE SCHOOL



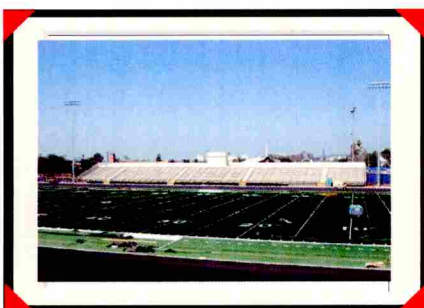
The completion of four new science classrooms finishes the schoolwide modernization at Yorba Linda Middle School. The science classrooms were modernized in 2008-2009 and were outfitted with new safety features, additional space, lab tables, improved lighting and interactive technology. Storage rooms were also built in between classrooms for science equipment. Classrooms, the library, school office, health office and other areas were completed prior to this project.

INTERACTIVE CLASSROOMS



Installation of interactive classroom technology was originally scheduled to be completed over four years but was accelerated to one-and-a-half years. The equipment includes: interactive white boards, student response pads, distributed sound systems, document cameras, writing tablets, LCD projectors, and switching systems. As of June 2009, this technology was installed school-wide at: Valadez, Yorba Linda Middle, Glenknoll, Lakeview and Sierra Vista schools. BRADFORD STADIUM



Phase I of the District's Bradford Stadium project started in June 2008 and was completed at the end of August 2008 in time for the first home football game of the season. Phase I included the installation of a synthetic football/soccer field and new synthetic track. The renovation also included the relocation of the scoreboard, new discus and shot put areas, new interior security fencing, lighting and sound system. New bleachers, restrooms, concession area and entry are now designed and awaiting approval at the Department of State Architect's (DSA) Office.
